THE AOC TODAY

Electronic Warfare has been, and remains, a critical enabling capability in military operations in peace and war. With the evolution of digital and computer technology, EW, IO, cyber EM activities, SIGINT and related disciplines are increasingly necessary to achieve situational awareness, knowledge superiority, strategic and tactical dominance, and force and platform protection in both offensive and defensive operations. Today the AOC has over 13,000 members from 47 countries, including 67 chapters in 21 countries. The HQ is in Alexandria, Virginia; one fifth of the membership is non-US and this is the fastest growing group.

The United Kingdom Chapter, the first and largest outside the US, was formed in 1972 and has a membership of over 500 from all ranks of the armed forces, industry, research establishments and academia. All members receive free monthly copies of the outstanding Journal of Electronic Defense (JED), and UK members are informed of all local UK activities through regular newsletters.

HISTORY OF THE AOC

During the Second World War US Electronic Countermeasures (ECM) operators, tasked to intercept and disrupt enemy communications and radars, were given the code name 'Raven' to provide a degree of security to their existence. They followed UK operational initiatives like 101 Squadron within the Main Bomber Force and later 100 (Bomber Support) Group, aimed at taking the new EW battle to the enemy. After WW II, US military jargon subsequently changed the name of these former Ravens and they became known as 'Old Crows'. In 2013 Chapter members participated in the classified UK EM Environment review and development of subsequent policy.

UK CHAPTER ACTIVITIES

The UK Chapter arranges a varied programme of activities throughout the year including visits to military establishments such as the Maritime Warfare Centre and Air Warfare Centre, NATO Joint EW Core Staff, to Operational units, to industry and government organisations such as GCHQ and Dstl and to places of historic interest such as Bletchley Park. There are also great opportunities for networking and professional development for anyone changing careers, seeking new opportunities, etc.

UK CHAPTER AWARDS

The UK Chapter makes awards to military units whose work is coherent with the AOC Mission. Recent examples include operational awards to 14 Sig Regt (EW), 3 Cdo Royal Marines, 225 Sig Sqn (FP(ECM)) and the Fleet EW Support Group. Other awards for EW-related excellence and training are made to the RN, RAF, and Army. An award to the best Physics students in each Form was recently initiated with Welbeck Defence 6th Form College. Outstanding Individuals are also recognised and the UK Chapter welcomes more nominations from industry, academia and the defence scientific community and are keen to support apprentice schemes and STEM programmes.
